UNCRC Day and Its Significance

UNCRC Day, celebrated annually on November 20th, marks the adoption of the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child in 1989. This day serves as a global reminder of the commitment to protect and uphold the rights of children. The UNCRC sets out the civil, political, economic, social, and cultural rights of every child, regardless of their race, religion, or abilities.

The Right to Education (UNCRC Article 28)

Article 28 of the UNCRC outlines the right to education for children. It recognizes that education is a fundamental right and that states should make primary education compulsory and available to all. It also emphasizes that secondary education, including vocational and higher education, should be accessible to every child. Education should be directed to the development of the child's personality, talents, and mental and physical abilities to their fullest potential.
